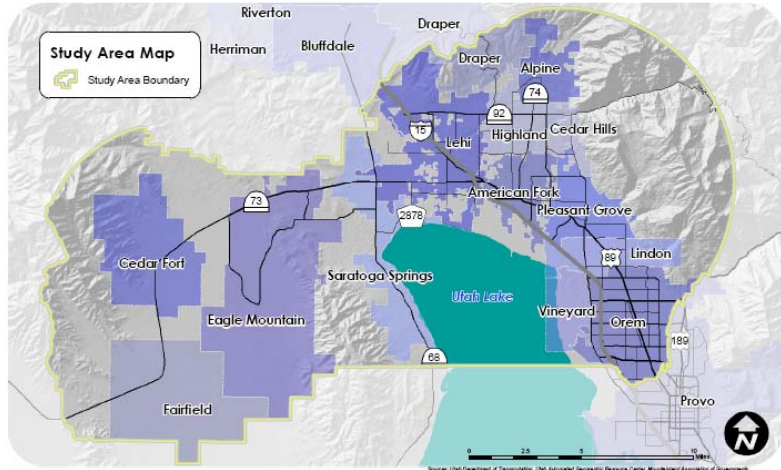


### What area does the study include?

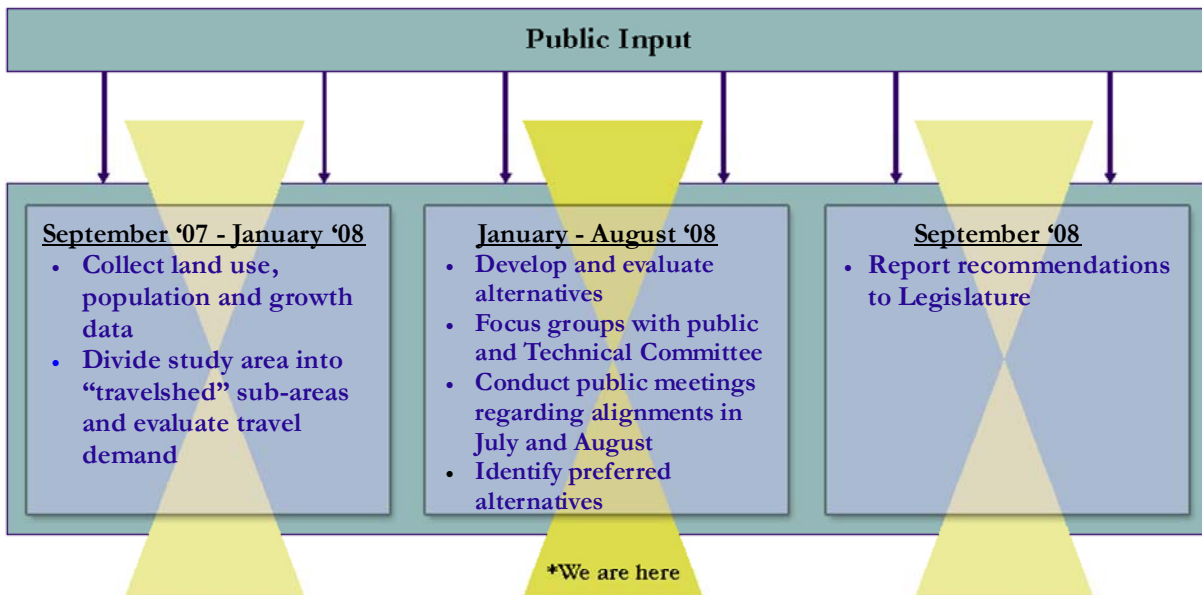

### What does the study involve?

The Utah County East-West Corridor Study is associated with House Bill 108 which provides funding to study east-west mobility along the Wasatch Front. The study will identify transportation projects and strategies to satisfy travel demand, alleviate congestion, and promote long-term corridor preservation through the year 2040. This study aims to be comprehensive and coordinated by incorporating growth projections and planned transportation projects for the area.



### Who are the project partners?

Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) is working with cities through both the Technical Committee and Regional Planning Committee. The Technical Committee is comprised of city representatives with engineering and planning expertise. The Regional Planning Committee is made up of local elected officials from area communities. Together they are researching and developing recommendations to report to the legislature and use as tools for developing the 2040 Regional Transportation Plan.

### ***Are there opportunities for the public to get involved in the study?***

Public input is critical to the study process. Local citizen knowledge helps the project team determine which alternatives best meet the needs of the area. The study team considers public input during all stages of this study and will provide feedback on how public input influences any decisions made.

In February 2008, the project team held a series of public workshops throughout northern Utah County. At these meetings the public was asked to provide input on transportation network preferences. Transportation network options included a Collector-Based Network, Arterial-Based Network, Freeway-Based Network, and a Transit-Based network. Approximately 250 people attended the six meetings. The following are the results from the meetings:
